Capital District Data Looks to the Future

For the better part of 30 years, the Capital District Regional Planning Commission has been producing the bi-monthly newsletter Capital District Data (CDD) as a means to inform the region on available data sources. It has been truly a pleasure to serve and inform the members of our region with up to date data, including everything from tax data to unemployment rates.

While the mission to serve and inform our members will not change, CDRPC is exploring new opportunities to best utilize CDD. Since CDD was originally launched the internet has transformed how data is disseminated. Today the public and private sectors have unprecedented access to data whenever it is needed. To this point CDD's mission to act as a conduit for data has been rendered sometimes redundant. As a result, CDD will explore new niches for data.

No immediate change is planned for Capital District Data, instead over the next five issues slight changes can be expected in the delivery of commonly available data. A more pronounced change is expected in the January/February 2016 issue, at which time a re-launch of the publication is expected.

Future issues of CDD will provide continued updates on any upcoming changes. The March/April issue will include a means in which to provide feedback to CDD's editorial staff. In the meantime, readers can expect the same high quality data releases that have been the hallmark of CDD for 30+ years.

Save the Date! March 27, 2015 Annual Planning & Zoning Workshop

The Capital District Regional Planning Commission will be holding the first of its biannual Local Government Planning and Zoning Workshops on March 27, 2015. The conference will be held at the Bulmer Telecommunications Center at Hudson Valley Community College and will take place between 8 AM and 3:30 PM.

There will be a morning plenary session entitled "Stream Basics for Planning for Flood Resilience", which will provide an overview of stream dynamics and provide guidance on steps that communities can take to decrease vulnerability to flooding.

Following the plenary session there will be two morning breakout sessions- "Zoning Board Overview," which will include discussion on the powers and duties of the Zoning Board of Appeals, and "Stream Repair and Natural Resource Planning," which will include presentations on stream resilience, as well as developing and using a natural resource inventory.

Following lunch there will be three concurrent sessions- "Planning Board Overview," a review of the role of a planning board, "Green Infrastructure Practices," a discussion on GI practices, and "Climate and Energy," a presentation on solar energy policy for local communities.

American Community Survey 3-year Estimate Comparison: Educational Attainment & Median Household Income

Pages 2 and 3 of this edition of CDD compares American Community Survey (ACS) results from the four counties and New York State for Educational Attainment and Household Income Range. The Census Bureau publishes yearly estimates for the ACS in three different reports, a 1-year estimate,

3-year estimate, and 5-year estimate. The tables provide the data for two separate, non-overlapping, time frames- using the 3 year ACS estimate (2008-10 & 2011-13). This allows for a comparison between two different periods of time.

encouraging. Educational attainment has continued to improve, with a higher percentage of the population over 25 in the four counties obtaining at least an Associate's Degree when compared to the 2008-10 time period. Albany County had the largest percentage with a Graduate or Professional Degree (18.35%)

Rensselaer County showed the largest percentage of those with an Associate's Degree (13.57%) while Saratoga County had the largest percentage with a Bachelor's Degree (22.46%)

Household income also shifted upwards across the four counties. Growth was concentrated in the highest income brackets, with households earning \$100,000+ annually increasing from 2008-10. Saratoga County accounted for the highest percentage of households with an income of greater than \$100,000 annually (31.76%), followed by Albany County (25.35%), Rensselaer County (25.14%), and then Schenectady County (21.54%). Statewide, 27.08% of households had income greater than \$100,000 annually. Nationally, 22.24% of households had an income greater than \$100,000 annually.
